Overhead Door Technician Training Fact Sheet

Overhead door technician (ODT) is now a designated occupation under Alberta's Apprenticeship and Industry Training Act. There are two levels of certification. Overhead door technicians install and maintain overhead sectional doors, rolling steel doors, multi-blade doors, rubber roll-up doors, rolling steel fire doors, electric door openers, electric gate openers, and access control devices in residential, commercial and industrial sites.

ODT Certification **Level One** - Based on Credentials

- Successful completion of Overhead Door Technician -Level One course as delivered by the Canadian Door Institute (CDI)
- Pass the required exam(s)
- Submission of Occupational Certificate Credentials Application with \$150.00 fee

ODT Certification **Level One** - Based on Work Experience

- Completion of 1,500 hours of work experience in 18 months
- Pass the required exam(s)
- Submission of Occupational Certificate Work Experience Application with \$450.00 fee

ODT Certification **Level Two** - Based on Credentials

- Successful completion of Overhead Door Technician -Level One certification as delivered by the Canadian Door Institute (CDI)
- Successful completion of Overhead Door Technician -Level Two course as delivered by CDI
- Pass the required exam(s)
- Submission of Occupational Certificate Credentials Application with \$150.00 fee

- Submission of Occupational Certificate Work Experience Application with \$450.00 fee

- Successful completion of Overhead Door Technician Level One and Level Two courses as delivered by the Canadian Door Institute (CDI)
- Completion of 2,000 hours of work experience in 24 months
- Pass the required exam(s)
- Submission of Occupational Certificate Credentials Application with \$150.00 fee
